What is

the Islamic belief about the creation and nature of angels?

Answer 1:

Munkar and Nakir, and what is their role?

Answer 9:

Munkar and Nakir are the two angels assigned to question the deceased in their graves.

They ask about the individual's belief in Allah, their faith, and their thoughts about Prophet Muhammad.

Their questioning helps determine the soul's condition in the afterlife.

Why are

angels described as "honored servants" in Islamic belief?

Answer 10:

Angels are described as honored servants because they are close to Allah, perpetually worshipping Him, and carry out His commands without question.

They do not possess any divine attributes and fear Allah, showing absolute obedience and humility (Quran 16:50).

This makes them exemplary beings in submission to Allah.
